PACKING FOR CAMP

- Large Plastic Tote We suggest packing for camp in a large plastic tote (storage bin). Plastic is much easier to disinfect than porous surfaces such as cloth. Lutherdale staff will be disinfecting camper luggage with EPA-approved disinfectants before taking it to the cabins.
- Mask or Face Covering Masks also referred to as face coverings are one of the best NPI available to reduce the spread of COVID-19, particularly when used universally within a community. Masks should be identified by the camper's name or initials inside and should not be shared with anyone else. For fabric masks, choose those with two to three layers of permeable fabric. Ensure that masks completely cover the nose and mouth of all campers and staff and that masks fit snugly and don't have gaps. We ask that camper bring 5-6 masks for a Full Week Program and 3-4 for a Weekend Program.
- **Hand Sanitizer** Lutherdale has hand sanitizer dispensers installed in many locations around camp. Campers and staff will be encouraged to use it. If campers would like to bring a small bottle for personal use, they are welcome to do so.
- Reusable Water Bottle While this is a staple at camp, this summer it is going to be imperative. Hydration is very important to keep campers healthy. To reduce "touchpoints", we prefer that campers bring water bottles that have a removable drinking spout/top when filling.
- **Label Everything** Permanently write, or better yet, use sewn or ironed-on labels that include the first and last name.
- **Don't Pack Anything of Value** Things do get lost, damaged, and/or borrowed while at camp. Old t-shirts, sweatshirts and shorts are quite the style at camp!
- > Think Layers Even in the peak summer months, mornings and evenings can be chilly.
- ➤ <u>Gear up for Camp</u> The Lutherdale store is available online and has the latest Lutherdale gear for you to purchase. The camp store will not be open on arrival and departure days. Campers will have an opportunity to visit the camp store during their session. You can purchase items online and we will have them available for your camper upon arrival.
- Special Note about Cell Phones Campers are not allowed to have cell phones at camp. While it may seem counter-intuitive, we have found that campers who bring cell phones have a harder time adjusting to camp life and can have more difficulty with homesickness. A large part of camp is learning to be independent and you can help your camper succeed by making sure they do not bring a cell phone.
